From the Executive Director

Dear Friends:



We are pleased to present our Annual Report for Fiscal Year 2018, during which we celebrated our 28th anniversary serving vulnerable children. Court Appointed Special Advocate volunteers, a talented Board of Directors, and a skilled team of staff members joined together with over 600 donors to support our advocacy for maltreated children in courtrooms and in communities throughout Talbot, Dorchester, Queen Anne's, and Kent Counties.

CASA of the Mid-Shore serves as a bridge in the child welfare system by providing screened and trained Court Appointed Special Advocates to advocate on behalf of children who have been mistreated or whose parents are unable to safely care for them. Each Court Appointed Special Advocate volunteer, as an officer of the court, provides information and assessments that assist judges in making critical decisions about the future of these children. With such an important mission at our core, it is no surprise that our work directly impacts positive outcomes for children.

The unfortunate reality is that the maltreated children we serve frequently believe that they deserve the abuse, neglect, or indifference directed at them. A parent's unwillingness or inability to provide the care a child desperately needs is too often internalized by that child as rejection. It is not unusual for children who have been hurt or neglected by their parents to feel unloved and hopeless. At CASA we try to change that dynamic, so in addition to advocating for what is best for these children we do something more. We show up for each child, we are constants in an ever-changing sea of people, and we speak up for each child's needs.

Our CASA volunteers know firsthand what consistency means to children who have been neglected or abused. Our volunteers appreciate what it means to these children to have a relationship with an adult where each child's safety and well-being is the focal point. One of our

CASA volunteers was recently told by his assigned child: "I don't know where I'd be if it wasn't for you." While the volunteer thinks that this may be an overstatement, the sentiment provides insight into the overarching mission of CASA. Simply put, we are a consistent and supportive presence in the lives of precious children who may have no one else in their corner. We fiercely and competently advocate for their well-being in all facets of their lives.

The unarguable truth is that CASA's active involvement and advocacy in the lives of children makes a positive, meaningful difference. Scores of studies have provided empirical evidence of this benefit. As CASA volunteer Bob Cowin succinctly explains, "CASA makes a difference in the classroom; CASA makes a difference in the therapy room; CASA makes a difference in the courtroom; and CASA can make a difference in the room of life."

Our goals moving forward include our commitment to ensuring that all children who need us in Talbot, Dorchester, Queen Anne's, and Kent Counties continue to have CASA volunteers speaking up for them. To meet this goal, we need more CASA volunteers to join our ranks. Please consider becoming a Court Appointed Special Advocate

or encourage someone you know to step up to this unique volunteer opportunity. We also hope to create a stronger presence throughout our region and are happy to speak to your business, club, civic group, or faith-based organization.

Last, but certainly not least, we need continued financial support throughout our four-county service region in order to provide a strong, steady presence for those children who need us. Your contributions play a vital role in the continued viability and success of CASA of the Mid-Shore and, by extension, the lives of these children.





The Children We Serve

We are pleased to report again this year that we succeeded in providing Court Appointed Special Advocates to all of the children referred to us by the Circuit Courts in Talbot, Dorchester, Queen Anne's, and Kent Counties! Due to confidentiality laws protecting their privacy, we are not able to show photographs of the children we serve. We can, however, share statistics and demographics about them. This page provides a snapshot of the ages, gender, and racial identity of the 66 children served by Court Appointed Special Advocates in FY 2018.





2018 Successes

100% of the children who were referred to us by the Talbot, Dorchester, Queen Anne's, and Kent County Circuit Courts had CASA volunteers appointed to their cases.

We welcomed $\overline{7}$ new CASA volunteers to the team.


66 local children knew that they had CASA volunteers in their corner.

95.5% of our recommendations regarding the best interest of these children were accepted by the courts.

Of the **14** children whose cases closed during the fiscal year:

- 2 were reunified with a parent
- 6 were adopted
- 3 were living with a relative
- 3 turned 21 years of age and were living independently

Countless hours resulted in a myriad of positive outcomes for children.


